Project Objective

SI is implementing a five-year USAID-funded Liberia Strategic Analysis Activity with the goal to provide an innovative degree of analytical and advisory services to USAID/Liberia's Office of Program and Project Development (PPD) and Development Objective (DO) teams in support of the Mission's project design, performance monitoring and evaluation, and operational learning and adapting.

The project has a support unit in Monrovia to assist the USAID Mission in strengthening its management of key aspects of the programming cycle, specifically strategic planning; project design; performance monitoring and evaluation; and institutionalized learning and adaptation.

Position Description

SI intends to hire two part-time GIS Enumerator consultants to participate in a GIS data collection initiative to support the USAID/Liberia Mission. Each GIS Enumerator will receive approximately 50 days level of effort over four months and will work under the supervision of an expatriate GIS Specialist.

The GIS Enumerators will gather secondary GIS data from Implementing Partners (IPs) and stakeholders by meeting with them and from the field using GIS devices. GIS Enumerators will also review the data they collect to ensure that it is accurate and organized in a way that makes the creation of maps and GIS analysis rapid. Similar to a survey enumerator, GIS Enumerators will also collect other data to pair with GIS coordinates to expand the amount of information that LSA is able to map for the Mission.

****Please note: This is a local position. Only candidates with Liberian citizenship will be considered.****

Responsibilities:

- Capture GIS data in different formats using GPS, electronic data recorders, digitizers, and other means.

- Extensive travel to the field to capture GIS data.
- Download, convert and upload GIS data available from internal and external sources to make them usable.
- Perform GIS data quality control, including reviewing data for completeness and accuracy; identifying and correcting errors or omissions in the data.
- Catalog and inventory GIS data, including metadata creation.
- Input, update and maintain GIS databases, including backups and also maintaining linkages to other databases.
- Perform GIS spatial analyses.
- Create map layouts and views, and generate maps and reports.
- Develop new applications and train others in the use of these applications.

Qualifications:

- Accreditation in GIS
- Bachelor of Science in geography, computer science, or engineering.
- At least three of years of experience in the use of GIS for social science research.
- Attention to detail, good writing and oral communication skills, knowledge of GIS programming.
- Demonstrated ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with supervising personnel, co-workers, business professionals, and the public.
- Ability to maintain high degree of confidentiality in day-to-day work and demonstrated ability to exercise good judgment and communicate effectively orally and in writing.
- Ability to establish, maintain, and prepare records and reports.
- Familiarity with business operations and activities.
- Must be a Liberian with fluency in oral and written English.
