

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRESIDENT'S DAILY ACTIVITIES – Wednesday, July 6, 2016

- A President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf has made additional appointments in government - affecting the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, and Internal Affairs. These appointments are subject to confirmation by the Honorable Liberian Senate where applicable.
- The Cabinet, at its regular sitting, has reviewed additional performance updates and accordingly mandated critical decisions covering the government's Legislative Agenda, Executive Orders, the Energy Sector, Public Procurement, the Economy, the 2016/2017 Budget, LRA Revenue-Generation and Real Estate Tax. The body, on Wednesday, July 6, was updated on the status of Bills mentioned in the 2016 Annual Message and submitted to the Legislature, Bills previously submitted but recalled; Bills not mentioned in the Annual Message but submitted to the Legislature; new Bills under review, Bills passed into Law as well as Bills promised - received and are under review by the Office of the Legal Advisor to the President.
- President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf has congratulated Liberian Muslims and colleagues across the world on the occasion of the successful end of the Holy Month of Ramadan. The President, on behalf of the government, the people of Liberia and in her own name, expressed delight over the milestone achievement of Liberians Muslims in their lives. She then urged all Muslims to join other Liberians to pray for peaceful co-existence and prosperity in our land for the sake of future generations.
- President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf on Wednesday, July 6, held talks with two separate delegations from the United Nations Children Fund (UNICEF) and Carter Center. Both delegations involved international representations. The UNICEF Delegation, which included representation from The Power of Nutrition through its Chief Executive Officer, Martin Short and Director of Investment, Mavis Owusu-Gyamfi briefed President Sirleaf about its US\$10 dollars Nutrition-Program in Liberia. During a meeting with the delegation from the Carter Center led by a former UN Deputy SRSG and Vice President/Peace Program of the Center, Jordon D. Ryan discussed the 2017 and crisis/conflict prevention before, during and after the elections. Mr. Ryan informed President Sirleaf that the Carter Center has monitored about 102 elections around the world and that Liberia is a key priority for the organization.
