

## **Highlights of President Sirleaf's Daily Activities**

### **Ghanaian Foreign Minister, H.E. Hanna S. Tetteh Pays Courtesy Call on President Sirleaf**

Ghana's Minister of Foreign Affairs and Regional Integration, Hanna Serwaa Tetteh, today paid a courtesy call on President Sirleaf.

H.E. Tetteh, earlier in the day, signed an Agreement with her Liberian counterpart, Augustine Kpehe Ngafuan that will lead to the establishment of a Permanent Joint Commission between the two countries.

### **President Sirleaf Meets with Sir Malcom Bruce and the UK Parliamentary Delegation**

President Sirleaf met in audience with a seven-member United Kingdom Parliamentarian on the Committee on International Development headed by Sir Malcom Bruce who chairs that Committee. They are in the country to assess Liberia's development particularly areas where the United Kingdom has made interventions particularly the health sector.

They will also meet with heads of multilateral organizations including the United Nations Mission in Liberia, World Bank to assess the performance of their support to Liberia. The United Kingdom is contributing up to £25 million to these institutions to see how well they are performing.

### **President Sirleaf Visits New Kru Town in the Wake of the Recent Ebola Outbreak**

President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf has renewed the commitment of her administration to fight the Ebola epidemic in Liberia.

President Sirleaf had gone to the Redemption Hospital to sympathize with the nurses who are mourning the loss of their colleague and at the same time encourage the nurses and Ministry of Health and Social Welfare officials for their service to the people and nation.

### **President Sirleaf Turns Over 13 Vehicles to the Liberia National Police**

President Sirleaf, this afternoon, inspected 13 brand new vehicles to be used by the Liberia National Police to facilitate its operation.

She stressed that the vehicles are to be assigned to the leeward counties when mobility for the police is always difficult and hoped the donation of the vehicles will enhance police operation in the rural counties of the country.
