

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 94

EXEMPTING THE LIBERIA ELECTRICITY CORPORATION FROM CUSTOMS DUTY AND GST ON GENERATION, TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS & FUEL

WHEREAS, the Liberia Electricity Corporation continues to expand its use of Hydroelectric power generated at the Mount Coffee facility to deliver affordable Electricity to customers; and

WHEREAS, during its transition from the use of fossil fuels to hydro power to generate electricity, LEC faces external market forces and risks that increase the costs of operations of the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, some of these costs, which are associated with the purchase, delivery, storage and use of fossil fuels, particularly Heavy Fuel Oils (HFO), represent a significant expense to LEC, which slow investments in the transition to the wider use of Hydroelectric power in Liberia; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that LEC achieve higher levels of operational and financial efficiencies such that it distributes electricity at affordable rates to customers; and

WHEREAS, to justify continued public and government support, LEC has to begin to return commercially sound results in terms of the expanding number of customer connections, and the guaranteed stability of its transmission and distribution systems; and

WHEREAS, Customs Duties and GST on petroleum products are a LEC cost category, which having the potential for volatility would adversely impact the monthly expenses of the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, an imperative exists for the Government of Liberia to initiate a policy which has the effect of stabilizing LEC costs, as well as giving the Corporation the ability to expand the number of connections to the National Electricity Grid; and

WHEREAS, LEC has a demonstrated need to minimize these expenses to prevent the per Kilowatt Hour cost of electricity in Liberia from increasing and to, in contrast, actively seek their systematic and long-term decline; and

WHEREAS, in the exercise of the Executive Power vested in the President by the Constitution, the former President has in the past issued executive orders exempting the Liberia Electricity Corporation from customs duties on fuel, the last of which was Executive Order #90 issued on November 28, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the need still exists to minimize the cost of fuel to enable the Liberia Electricity Corporation provide electricity to the general public at a reasonable price;

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of Liberia, in the interest of national reconstruction and development hereby exempts the Liberia Electricity Corporation from Customs Duty and GST on petroleum products, and the following categories of Equipment, Materials and Vehicles used by LEC in the conduct of operations:
