MISSION STATEMENT

JOB SUMMARY

The Community Health Officer (CHO) supports the implementation of community-based health interventions under the Community-based Maternal, Neonatal, and Child Health (CB-MNCH) Project in Nimba County. **Reporting directly to the Community Health Program Manager**, the CHO is responsible for coordinating, supervising, and supporting field-level community health activities, including Care Group implementation, household health promotion, community mobilization, and referral follow-up. The position works closely with Care Group Promoters, Community Health Volunteers (CHVs), health facilities, local authorities, and churches to ensure quality delivery of evidence-based health and behavior-change interventions while demonstrating Christ's love through compassionate service.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Support the implementation of community-based Maternal, Neonatal, and Child Health (MNCH) interventions using the Care Group Model in line with approved work plans, Samaritan's Purse standards, and Ministry of Health guidelines.
- Conduct regular field supervision of Care Group Promoters, Community Health Volunteers (CHVs), and community health activities to ensure quality implementation and accurate delivery of health messages.
- Monitor household visits, Care Group meetings, community dialogues, and referral follow-up activities, and provide on-the-job coaching and technical support to community-based staff and volunteers.
- Coordinate with health facilities, Ministry of Health representatives, community leaders, and partner churches to strengthen referral systems and promote effective community engagement.
- Support community mobilization activities, health awareness campaigns, and trainings focused on maternal, neonatal, and child health.
- Ensure accurate and timely completion of Care Group monitoring tools, CHV activity logs, referral records, attendance sheets, and other required documentation.
- Compile and submit weekly and monthly activity reports to the Community Health Program Manager.
- Support routine monitoring, data verification, and evaluation activities in collaboration with the Monitoring and Evaluation team.
- Assist with planning and coordination of trainings, supervision visits, and community meetings.

- Support proper use, care, and accountability of project equipment, supplies, and health education materials assigned for field activities.
- Spend approximately 75% of time supervising field-level activities, including Care Group sessions, promoter meetings, household visits, and supportive supervision of community-based staff.
- Take responsibility and accountability for project equipment, supplies, and Care Group materials under his/her care.
- Be willing to travel through rough terrain, including by motorbike, to reach remote communities and supervise community health activities.
- Attend daily morning devotions and participate in prayer support for the ministry, its donors, volunteers, and project communities.
- Maintain a strong Christian witness to colleagues, vendors, community health workers, beneficiaries, and the general public.
- With a generous and servant-hearted spirit, perform all other duties as assigned in support of Samaritan's Purse's mission.

QUALIFICATIONS

To perform this job successfully, an individual must maintain a personal relationship with and be a consistent witness for Jesus Christ, as well as able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- Diploma/Bachelor's degree in Health, Community Development, or a related field.
- Additional training and practice in health care management and community health interventions will be an added advantage.
- At least three years of related work experience with NGO community and public health programs based at a well-established medical health facility/ project.
- Experience in community mobilization, Care Group, or Community Health Volunteers based programming preferred
- Favorable to someone with experience in medical response to disaster areas and surveillance and control of communicable diseases in outbreak areas.
- Sensitivity to the needs and priorities of vulnerable populations.
- Strong communication skills, with excellent written and spoken English.
- Strong leadership skills and team management skills.
- Adaptable, flexible, and mature in judgment.
- Good assessment, analytical, planning, and reporting skills.
- Understanding of medical ethics and patient education.
- Confident and proficient in the use of MS Office.
- One year of college-level Biblical studies is strongly preferred.

- Willing to build local national staff capacity by utilizing training and coaching skills.
